Dear AMRPE Member,

Greetings, I am writing to give a summary of the 2019 legislative session including a "heads up" for HB 715. In a nutshell, this past legislative session was positive for retired public employees, positive in the sense that no action was taken against our retirement benefits. Our legislative lobbyists did an outstanding job of watching any bills that could negatively impact association members and helped ensure that no benefits were lost. The two study bills passed that relate to our retirement systems and may lead to changes down the road. One was a requirement to study the effects of merging the Public Employees Retirement System and the Teachers Retirement System into one single agency. The hope is that efficiencies will be gained from such a merger. Your board does not support this idea, as we understand that this would likely be very disruptive to both systems, and is unlikely that any minor efficiencies gained would not be worth the cost.

The second study bill that passed was HB 715, which provided for "a financial modernization and risk analysis study." A copy of this bill is on our website. The bill contains language that may ultimately affect the retirement systems, including statements like, "exploring revenue sufficiency for ... pensions" and "research related to ... pension stress testing (HB 715, page 8)." Not knowing what the end result of the study will be, our lobbyists will attend a few meetings of this study group and report back to the Board regarding the decisions and direction of the group. If we believe that the direction of the study group is not positive or that poor decisions are being made, we may seek your assistance in terms of contacting specific legislators.
